Don't Forget!

- ♦ Incorporate quotes to support your statements
- ♦ Use transition words and phrases to tie ideas and paragraphs (furthermore, moreover, additionally, in conclusion...)
- ♦ Insert the page number of the quotes in parentheses
- Always explain the context of a quote, a quote is not a paragraph on its own
- ♦ Write an analysis of the quote you are using
- ♦ Use **present** tense
- ♦ Use MLA formatting! Refer to the MLA formatting guidelines given in class.
- ♦ Revise
- ♦ Edit
- \(\rightarrow \text{Read your essay aloud; read it to someone else. Clarify thoughts that are confusing.} \)
- ♦ Use active voice; keep your ideas crisp and clear.

To keep your essay formal, do NOT:

- ♦ Use you, your, etc.
- ♦ Write "I think..I believe...just write your statements, and support them with strong examples and quotes
- When you use a quote, don't write that you are using a quote! Example: this quote shows
- ♦ Just summarize the novel! You are supporting a claim about the novel.
